Alzheimer's disease and other dementias

- There are many types of dementia.
- Dementia is not part of normal aging.
- Dementia is progressive it is experienced in stages.



Stigma Survey

- 46 per cent would feel ashamed or embarrassed if they had dementia.
- 61 per cent felt they would face discrimination of some kind.

 help a person with

 to need assistance.

First Link[®] benefits

- Initial contact an average of 11 months earlier than if families reached out on their own, with ongoing follow up.
- Support and learning opportunities that build confidence and skills to maintain quality of life as much as possible.
- Connection to a supportive community of others living with dementia.
